**AFRICA**

**CAR: SG's independent strategic review of MINUSCA**

Resolution [2709 \(2023\)](#) of 15 November 2023

Para. 58(c): Requests the Secretary-General, to conduct and provide the Security Council no later than 15 August 2024, with an independent strategic review of MINUSCA in accordance with best practices, stresses that the Review must be conducted based on broad consultations with the government of CAR and other relevant partners, including UN agencies, member States, regional organisations, civil society and independent experts, requests that such review assess the challenges to peace and security in the CAR, and provide detailed recommendations regarding the possible reconfiguration of MINUSCA's mandate, on mission's effectiveness, adequation of resources, and options for gradually adapting its civilian, police, and military components, as appropriate, as well as recommendations for a possible transition plan and eventual drawdown of MINUSCA when conditions are met;

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in August 2024.

**Libya: UNSMIL: SG to report to SC on the implementation of resolution [2702 \(2023\)](#)**

Resolution [2702 \(2023\)](#) of 30 October 2023

Para. 13: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council on the implementation of this resolution every 60 days;

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in August 2024.

**South Sudan (UNMISS): SG report on implementation of the UNMISS mandate and obstructions**

Resolution [2729 \(2024\)](#) of 29 April 2024

Para. 24: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council on implementation of the UNMISS mandate and the obstructions UNMISS encounters in doing so in a comprehensive written report to be submitted within 90 days of the date of adoption of this resolution, every 90 days thereafter, and underscores that such reporting should provide integrated, evidence-based and data-driven analysis, strategic assessments and frank advice to the Security Council and should include attention to: [...]

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in August 2024.

**Sudan: ICC Prosecutor briefing**

Resolution [1593 \(2005\)](#) of 31 March 2005

Para. 8. Invites the Prosecutor to address the Council within three months of the date of adoption of this resolution and every six months thereafter on actions taken pursuant to this resolution.

The ICC Prosecutor is expected to report in August 2024.

**ASIA/MIDDLE EAST**

**Middle East (Lebanon/UNIFIL): UNIFIL mandate**

Resolution [2695 \(2023\)](#) of 31 August 2023

Para.1: Decides to extend the present mandate of UNIFIL until 31 August 2024;

The UNIFIL mandate will expire on 31 August 2024.

## **The situation in the Middle East, including the Palestinian question**

Resolution [1322 \(2000\)](#) of 7 October 2000

Para. 7: Invites the Secretary-General to continue to follow the situation and to keep the Security Council informed.

The Secretary-General is expected to report in August 2024.

## **Middle East (Syria): SG report on the implementation of resolution [2268 \(2016\)](#)**

Resolution [2268 \(2016\)](#) of 26 February 2016

Para. 10: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Council on the implementation of this resolution, including by drawing on information provided by the ISSG ceasefire taskforce, and on resolution [2254 \(2015\)](#), within 15 days of the adoption of this resolution and every 30 days thereafter;

The Secretary-General is expected to report in August 2024.

## **Middle East (Syria): OPCW DG to report to SC (through SG) on implementation of resolution [2118 \(2013\)](#)**

Resolution [2118 \(2013\)](#) of 27 September 2013

Para. 12: Decides to review on a regular basis the implementation in the Syrian Arab Republic of the decision of the OPCW Executive Council of 27 September 2013 and this resolution, and requests the Director-General of the OPCW to report to the Security Council, through the Secretary-General, who shall include relevant information on United Nations activities related to the implementation of this resolution, within 30 days and every month thereafter, and requests further the Director-General of the OPCW and the Secretary-General to report in a coordinated manner, as needed, to the Security Council, non-compliance with this resolution or the OPCW Executive Council decision of 27 September 2013.

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in August 2024.

## **Middle East (Yemen): SG to report to SC on implementation of resolution [2691 \(2023\)](#)**

Resolution [2691 \(2023\)](#) of 10 July 2023

Para. 2: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council on a monthly basis on progress regarding the implementation of this resolution, in accordance with paragraph 8 of resolution [2643 \(2022\)](#);

Resolution [2643 \(2022\)](#) of 13 July 2022

Para. 8: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council on a monthly basis on progress regarding the implementation of this resolution, including, inter alia on any obstructions to the effective operation of UNMHA caused by any party, any violations of the Hodeidah Agreement ceasefire, any attempts to bring any military reinforcements and military objects to and through the city, the ports of Hodeidah, Salif, and Ras Issa, and the governorate, any failures to remove any military manifestations from the city, and on resolution [2451 \(2018\)](#), including on any non-compliance by any party;

The Secretary-General is expected to report in August 2024.

**Middle East (Yemen): SG to report to SC under resolution 2722 (2024)**

Resolution 2739 (2024) of 27 June 2024

Para. 1: Extends the reporting request in paragraph 10 of resolution 2722 (2024) until January 15, 2025;

Resolution 2722 (2024) of 10 January 2024

Para. 10: Requests the Secretary-General provide written monthly reports, through July 1, 2024, to the Security Council on any further Houthi attacks on merchant and commercial vessels in the Red Sea to inform the Council's future consultations;

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in August 2024.

## COUNTER-TERRORISM/NON-PROLIFERATION

**ISIL (Da'esh) and Al-Qaeda: SG strategic-level reports**

Resolution 2734 (2024) of 10 June 2024

Para. 109: Emphasizing the threat posed to international peace and security by ISIL and associated individuals, groups, undertakings, and entities, requests the Secretary-General to continue to provide strategic-level reports that demonstrate and reflect the gravity of the aforementioned threat, including from foreign terrorist fighters joining ISIL and associated groups and entities, foreign terrorist fighters returning to their countries of origin, transiting through, traveling to or relocating to or from other Member States, and the sources of financing of these groups and entities including through illicit trade in petroleum, antiquities, and other natural resources, as well as their planning and facilitation of attacks, any support to ISIL, Al-Qaida or any individual included on the ISIL and Al-Qaida Sanctions List, and reflects the range of United Nations efforts in support of Member States in countering this threat, particularly that reflects the impact of these efforts, the next report to be provided by 31 July 2024 and then every six months thereafter, with the input of CTED, in close collaboration with the Monitoring Team, UNOCT, and other relevant United Nations actors, and with the threat assessment portion of the report to be covered by the latest Monitoring Team's bi-annual report being annexed to the Secretary General's report;

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in August 2024.

**Non-proliferation/DPRK: Sanctions: 1718 Committee reports**

Resolution 1718 (2006) of 14 October 2006

Para. 12: Decides to establish, in accordance with rule 28 of its provisional rules of procedure, a Committee of the Security Council consisting of all the members of the Council, to undertake the following tasks:  
(g) To report at least every 90 days to the Security Council on its work, with its observations and recommendations, in particular on ways to strengthen the effectiveness of the measures imposed by paragraph 8 above.

The Committee Chair is expected to report in August 2024.

## OTHER

**Maintenance of international peace & security: Migrant smuggling: SG to report to SC on the implementation of SCR 2698 (2023) (SCR 2240)**

Resolution 2698 (2023) of 29 September 2023

Para. 6: Renews the reporting requests set out in paragraph 17 of its resolution 2240 (2015) from the date of adoption of this resolution, and requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council eleven months after the adoption of this resolution on its implementation, in particular with regard to the implementation of paragraphs 7 to 10 of its resolution 2240 (2015);

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in August 2024.
