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SECURITY COUNCIL FOR THE MONTH OF OCTOBER 2024**

AFRICA

CAR: SG reports on the situation in CAR and MINUSCA

Resolution [2709 \(2023\)](#) of 15 November 2023

Para. 58(a): Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Council on 15 February 2024, 15 June 2024 and 13 October 2024 on the progress in implementing MINUSCA's mandate, as well as on the situation in the CAR, including on all elements set out in paragraph 58 (a) of resolution [2659 \(2022\)](#);

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in October 2024.

Libya: UNSMIL: SG to report to SC on the implementation of resolution [2702 \(2023\)](#)

Resolution [2702 \(2023\)](#) of 30 October 2023

Para. 13: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council on the implementation of this resolution every 60 days;

The Secretary-General is expected to report in October 2024.

Somalia: ATMIS: SG comprehensive update on UNSCR [2748 \(2024\)](#)

Resolution [2748 \(2024\)](#) of 15 August 2024

Para. 10: Requests a comprehensive update from the Secretary-General on these requests by 11 October 2024 and expresses its intention to convene a private meeting in October to discuss this update with the African Union and Somalia, with the participation of the Secretariat;

The Secretary-General is expected to report in October 2024.

Somalia: Sanctions: SG update on progress against benchmarks

Resolution [2713 \(2023\)](#) of 1 December 2023

Para. 45(b): from the Secretary-General: i. an update on progress against each indicator set out in the benchmarks contained with the technical assessment report ([S/2022/698](#)) by 15 October 2024, and requests that this assessment is: 1. extended to all regions of Somalia where practicable, with specific recommendations and benchmarks as appropriate; and, 2. elaborates an additional benchmark on the safe management of chemical precursors associated with IED manufacture and disposal;

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in October 2024.

South Sudan: SG report on implementation of the UNMISS mandate and obstructions

Resolution [2729 \(2024\)](#) of 29 April 2024

Para. 24: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council on implementation of the UNMISS mandate and the obstructions UNMISS encounters in doing so in a comprehensive written report to be submitted within 90 days of the date of adoption of this resolution, every 90 days thereafter, and underscores that such reporting should provide integrated, evidence-based and data-driven analysis, strategic assessments and frank advice to the Security Council and should include attention to: [...]

Sudan: SG to report on UN efforts to support Sudan (UNSCR 2715 (2023)) and the implementation of UNSCR 2736 (2024)

Resolution 2715 (2023) of 1 December 2023

Para. 7: Requests the Secretary-General to provide a written report in 90 days, and then brief the Security Council every 120 days on UN efforts to support Sudan on its path towards peace and stability, and to keep this reporting under review;

Resolution 2736 (2024) of 13 June 2024

Para. 9: Requests the Secretary-General to report on the implementation of all elements of this resolution within his regular updates as stipulated in resolution 2715 (2023);

The Secretary-General is expected to report in October 2024

Sudan/South Sudan: SG to inform SC of progress in implementing UNISFA's mandate

Resolution 2708 (2022) of 14 November 2023

Para. 5: Requests the Secretary-General to continue to inform the Security Council of progress in implementing UNISFA's mandate as set out in paragraph 34 of resolution 2609 (2021), as well as on progress on the issues described in paragraph 5 of resolution 2630 (2022), with combined written reports provided on 1 May 2024 and 15 October 2024;

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in October 2024.

Western Sahara: SG report on Western Sahara

Resolution 2703 (2023) of 30 October 2023

Para 11: Requests the Secretary-General to brief the Security Council on a regular basis, and at any time he deems appropriate during the mandate period, to include within six months of this mandate's renewal and again prior to its expiration, on the status and progress of these negotiations under his auspices, on the implementation of this resolution, assessment of MINURSO's operations and steps taken to address challenges, expresses its intention to meet to receive and discuss his briefings and in this regard, further requests the Secretary-General to provide a report on the situation in Western Sahara well before the end of the mandate period;

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in October 2024.

AMERICAS

Haiti: SG reports on BINUH on the implementation of resolution 2743 (2024)

Resolution 2743 (2024) of 12 July 2024

Para. 1: Decides to extend, to 15 July 2025 the mandate of BINUH in accordance with its resolution 2476 (2019), headed by a Special Representative of the Secretary-General of the United Nations, and the reporting requirements as specified in paragraph 1 of resolution 2645 (2022);

Haiti: UNODC to report to the SC through the SG on illicit arms and financial flows

Resolution 2743 (2024) of 12 July 2024

Para. 19: Requests BINUH to work with UNODC and other relevant UN agencies to support Haitian authorities in combating illicit trafficking and diversion of arms and related materiel as well as illicit financial flows and in enhancing management and control of borders and ports and to include the progress of relevant work in the Secretary-General's regular report to the Security Council, and further commends the quarterly report of UNODC to the Security Council, concurrent with the reporting cycle of BINUH, through the Secretary-General, and in this regard reiterates its request to UNODC to continue its quarterly update which shall continue to focus on sources and routes of illicit arms and financial flows, relevant UN activities and recommendations;

The situation in the Middle East, including the Palestinian question

Para. 7: Invites the Secretary-General to continue to follow the situation and to keep the Security Council informed.

Para. 7: Requests that the Secretary-General report to the Security Council within thirty days on the implementation by the parties of this resolution and decides to remain actively seized of the matter.

S/PRST/2004/36 of 19 October 2004

Last para.: The Security Council appreciates the Secretary-General's intention to keep the Council updated. It requests that he continue to report on the implementation of the resolution to the Council every six months.

Para. 10: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Council on the implementation of this resolution, including by drawing on information provided by the ISSG ceasefire taskforce, and on resolution [2254 \(2015\)](#), within 15 days of the adoption of this resolution and every 30 days thereafter;

The Secretary-General is expected to report in October 2024.

Middle East (Syria): OPCW DG to report to SC (through SG) on implementation of resolution [2118 \(2013\)](#)

Resolution [2118 \(2013\)](#) of 27 September 2013

Para. 12: Decides to review on a regular basis the implementation in the Syrian Arab Republic of the decision of the OPCW Executive Council of 27 September 2013 and this resolution, and requests the Director-General of the OPCW to report to the Security Council, through the Secretary-General, who shall include relevant information on United Nations activities related to the implementation of this resolution, within 30 days and every month thereafter, and requests further the Director-General of the OPCW and the Secretary-General to report in a coordinated manner, as needed, to the Security Council, non-compliance with this resolution or the OPCW Executive Council decision of 27 September 2013.

The report is expected to be presented in October 2024.

Middle East (Yemen): SG to report to SC on implementation of resolution [2742 \(2024\)](#)

Resolution [2742 \(2024\)](#) of 8 July 2024

Para. 2: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council on a monthly basis on progress regarding the implementation of this resolution, in accordance with paragraph 8 of resolution [2643 \(2022\)](#);

Resolution [2643 \(2022\)](#) of 13 July 2022

Para. 8: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council on a monthly basis on progress regarding the implementation of this resolution, including, inter alia on any obstructions to the effective operation of UNMHA caused by any party, any violations of the Hodeidah Agreement ceasefire, any attempts to bring any military reinforcements and military objects to and through the city, the ports of Hodeidah, Salif, and Ras Issa, and the governorate, any failures to remove any military

manifestations from the city, and on resolution [2451 \(2018\)](#), including on any non-compliance by any party;

The Secretary-General is expected to report in [October 2024](#).

Middle East (Yemen): SG to report to SC under resolution [2722 \(2024\)](#)

Para. 1: Extends the reporting request in paragraph 10 of resolution [2722 \(2024\)](#) until January 15, 2025;

Para. 10: Requests the Secretary-General provide written monthly reports, through July 1, 2024, to the Security Council on any further Houthi attacks on merchant and commercial vessels in the Red Sea to inform the Council's future consultations;

The members of the Security Council have agreed upon a schedule of meetings on UNMIK, with concurrent Secretary-General reports to the Council. In 2019, the Council intends to hold briefings on 7 February, in June, and in October. As of 2020, the Council intends to hold briefings twice a year (in April and October) on the issue. The Council will continue to review this issue, taking into account the situation on the ground.
