#### **16. The question concerning Haiti**

During the period under review, the Security Council held ten meetings on the question concerning Haiti, including four closed meetings with troop- and police-contributing countries to the United Nations Stabilization Mission in Haiti (MINUSTAH),<sup>1</sup> and adopted two resolutions under Chapter VII of the Charter.<sup>2</sup>

The Council heard semi-annual briefings by senior officials of the Organization on the situation on the ground, addressing political and security conditions, activities of MINUSTAH, and humanitarian, recovery and development matters. The Council twice renewed the mandate of MINUSTAH for periods of one year.<sup>3</sup> In addition, the Security Council mission visited Haiti from 23 to 25 January 2015.<sup>4</sup>

By resolution [2243 \(2015\)](#), the Council expressed its intention to consider the possible withdrawal of MINUSTAH and transition to a future UN presence, based on the review by the Council of the overall capacity of Haiti to ensure security and stability and on the security conditions on the ground.<sup>5</sup>
