**TENTATIVE FORECAST OF THE PROGRAMME OF WORK OF THE
SECURITY COUNCIL FOR THE MONTH OF SEPTEMBER 2011**

For information only/not an official document

This tentative forecast of the programme of work of the Security Council has been prepared by the Secretariat for the President of the Council. The forecast covers in particular those matters that may be taken up during the month pursuant to earlier decisions of the Council. The fact that a matter is or is not included in the forecast carries no implication that it will or will not be taken up during the month: the actual programme of work will be determined by developments and the views of members of the Council.

Preliminary forecast for September 2011

AFRICA

Côte d'Ivoire – UNOCI

Resolution 1992 (2011) of 29 June

Para. 1: decides to authorize the Secretary-General, further to paragraph 1 of resolution 1968 (2011), paragraphs 3 and 4 of resolution 1967 (2011), paragraph 6 of resolution 1962 (2010), paragraph 1 of resolution 1951 (2010) and paragraphs 4 and 6 of resolution 1609 (2005), to extend until 30 September 2011 the redeployment from the United Nations Mission in Liberia (UNMIL) to the United Nations Operation in Côte d'Ivoire (UNOCI) of three armed helicopters with crews.

Para. 2: requests the Secretary-General to provide the Security Council with an updated analysis and recommendations on the inter-mission cooperation arrangements by 15 September 2011.

The Secretary-General is expected to provide an analysis and recommendations by 15 September 2011.

The authorization of the temporary redeployment from UNMIL to UNOCI expires on 30 September 2011.

Liberia – UNMIL

Resolution 1938 (2010) of 15 September 2010

Para. 2: authorizes the United Nations Mission in Liberia (UNMIL) to assist the Liberian Government, as requested, with the 2011 general presidential and legislative elections.

Para. 5: requests that the Secretary-General draw up, in coordination with the Government of Liberia, a joint transition plan on the transfer of responsibility for internal security from UNMIL to the appropriate national authorities.

Para. 9: requests the Secretary-General to continue to monitor progress on core benchmarks, in particular on preparations for the 2011 elections, and on building the capability of the Liberia National Police.

Para. 11: requests the Secretary-General to keep the Security Council regularly informed of the situation on the ground as Liberia enters this next critical phase, and to provide by 15 August 2011 a report on the issues addressed in paragraphs 2, 5, and 9 of this resolution.

The report of the Secretary-General dated 5 August 2011 (S/2011/497) is before the Security Council.

Para. 1: decides that the mandate of UNMIL shall be extended until 30 September 2011.

The UNMIL mandate expires on 30 September 2011.

Libya

Resolution 1973 (2011) of 17 March 2011

Para. 12: requests the Secretary-General to inform the Council immediately of any actions taken by the Member States concerned in exercise of the authority conferred by paragraph 8 of the resolution and to report to the Council within 7 days and every month thereafter on the implementation of this resolution, including information on any violations of the flight ban imposed by paragraph 6 of the resolution.

The Secretary-General is expected to report to the Security Council during September 2011.

Libyan Arab Jamahiriya – Sanctions Committee

Resolution 1970 (2011) of 26 February 2011

Para. 24 (e): decides to establish a Committee of the Security Council, inter alia, to report within 30 days to the Security Council on its work for the first report and thereafter to report as deemed necessary by the Committee.

The Chairman of the 1970 Committee is expected to report to the Security Council during September 2011.

Sierra Leone – UNIPSIL

Resolution 1941 (2010) of 29 September 2010

Para. 11: requests that the Secretary-General keep the Security Council informed every 6 months of progress made in the implementation of the mandate of the United Nations Integrated Peacebuilding Office in Sierra Leone (UNIPSIL) and this resolution.

Para. 6: calls upon the Secretary-General to develop a set of benchmarks for the transition of UNIPSIL into a UN Country Team presence, taking into account those already agreed upon by the Government and the UN in the Joint Vision for Sierra Leone, and the particular challenges involved in preparing for the 2012 elections, to keep these under active review, and regularly report on progress to the Security Council.

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in early September 2011.

Para. 1: decides to extend the mandate of UNIPSIL until 15 September 2011.

The mandate of UNIPSIL expires on 15 September 2011.

Somalia – peacebuilding and peacekeeping

Resolution 1964 (2010) of 22 December 2010

Para. 20: requests the Secretary-General to report on all aspects of this resolution every 4 months commencing 1 January 2011 and expresses its intention to review the situation, as part of the reporting obligations of the Secretary-General, as specified in the statement of the President of the Security Council of 31 October 2001 (S/PRST/2001/30) and Security Council resolutions 1863 (2009), 1872 (2009) and 1910 (2010).

The report of the Secretary-General dated 30 August 2011 (S/2011/549) is before the Security Council.

Somalia – AMISOM

Resolution 1964 (2010) of 22 December 2010

Para. 1: decides to authorize the member States of the African Union to maintain the deployment until 30 September 2011 of the African Union Mission in Somalia (AMISOM).

The authorization of AMISOM expires on 30 September 2011.

Para. 7: requests the Secretary-General to continue to provide a logistical support package for AMISOM called for by resolution 1863 (2009) for a maximum of 12,000 AMISOM troops, comprising equipment and services, including public information support, but not including the transfer of funds, as described in the Secretary-General's letter (S/2009/60) to the Security Council until 30 September 2011, ensuring the accountability and transparency of expenditures of United Nations funds as set out in paragraph 6 of resolution 1910 (2010).

The authorization of the UN logistical support package to AMISOM expires on 30 September 2011.

The Sudan – UNISFA

Resolution 1990 (2011) of 27 June 2011

Para.11: requests the Secretary-General to keep the Security Council regularly informed of the progress in implementing the Agreement between the Government of the Sudan and the Sudan People's Liberation Movement on Temporary Arrangements for the Administration and Security of the Abyei Area and to report to the Council no later than thirty days after the adoption of this resolution and every 60 days thereafter.

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued by 27 September 2011.

Para.12: decides to review the role of the United Nations Interim Security Force for Abyei (UNISFA) not later than 3 months after adoption of this resolution.

The Sudan – Sanctions Committee

Resolution 1591 (2005) of 29 March 2005

Para. 3(a)(iv): decides that the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1591 (2005) shall report at least every 90 days to the Security Council on its work.

The Chairman of the 1591 Committee is expected to report to the Security Council during September 2011.

AMERICAS

Haiti – MINUSTAH

Resolution 1944 (2010) of 14 October 2010

Para. 21: requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council on the implementation of the mandate of the United Nations Stabilization Mission in Haiti (MINUSTAH) not later than 45 days prior to its expiration.

Para. 22: requests the Secretary-General to include in his reports a comprehensive assessment of threats to security in Haiti and give particular attention to the protective environment for all, in particular women and children, and on progress in the sustainable resettlement of displaced persons, and to propose, as appropriate, options to reconfigure the composition of MINUSTAH.

The report of the Secretary-General dated 25 August 2011 (S/2011/540) is before the Security Council.

Para. 1: decides to extend the mandate of MINUSTAH until 15 October 2011.

The mandate of MINUSTAH expires on 15 October 2011.

ASIA

Afghanistan – UNAMA

Resolution 1974 (2011) of 22 March 2011

Para. 42: requests that the Secretary-General reports to the Council every three months on developments in Afghanistan, and to include in his reports an evaluation of progress made against the benchmarks for measuring and tracking progress in the implementation of the United Nations Assistance Mission in Afghanistan (UNAMA)'s mandate and priorities as set out in this resolution;

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued by 22 September 2011.

The situation in the Middle East, including the Palestinian question

Resolution 1322 (2000) of 7 October 2000

Para. 7: invites the Secretary-General to continue to follow the situation and to keep the Security Council informed.

EUROPE

Cyprus – good offices

S/PRST/2008/34 of 4 September 2008

Last para.: looks forward to being briefed on the progress of the good offices process.

The report of the Secretary-General dated 8 August 2011 (S/2011/498) is before the Security Council.

OTHER

Maintenance of international peace and security: optimizing the use of preventive diplomacy tools

S/PRST/2010/14 of 16 July 2010

Last para.: requests the Secretary-General to submit, within twelve months of the adoption of this statement, a report making recommendations on how best to optimize the use of preventive diplomacy tools within the United Nations system and in co-operation with regional and sub-regional organizations and other actors.

The report of the Secretary-General dated 30 August 2011 (S/2011/552) is before the Security Council.

Non-proliferation – Iran

Resolution 1737 (2006) of 23 December 2006

Para. 18(h): decides that the Committee established pursuant to resolution 1737 (2006) shall report at least every 90 days to the Security Council on its work and on the implementation of this resolution, with its observations and recommendations.

The Chairman of the 1737 Committee is expected to report to the Security Council during September 2011.

Counter-terrorism – CTC / CTED

Resolution 1963 (2010) of 20 December 2010

Para. 11: highlights the importance of the work programme of the Committee established pursuant to resolution 1373 (2001) concerning counter-terrorism (CTC) / Counter-Terrorism Committee Executive Directorate (CTED) and in this context looks forward to a special meeting open to the wider membership to commemorate the 10th anniversary of the adoption of resolution 1373 (2001) and the establishment of the Committee.

The special meeting of the Counter-Terrorism Committee will be held during September 2011.

Women peace and security

Resolution 1888 (2009) of 30 September 2009

Para 4: requests that the United Nations Secretary-General appoint a Special Representative to provide coherent and strategic leadership, to work effectively to strengthen existing United Nations coordination mechanisms, and to engage in advocacy efforts, inter alia with governments, including military and judicial representatives, as well as with all parties to armed conflict and civil society, in order to address, at both headquarters and country level, sexual violence in armed conflict.

Para 8: calls upon the Secretary-General to identify and take the appropriate measures to deploy rapidly a team of experts to situations of particular concern with respect to sexual violence in armed conflict.

Para 28: decides to review, taking into account the process established by General

Assembly resolution 63/311 regarding a United Nations composite gender entity, the mandates of the Special Representative requested in operative paragraph 4 and the Team of Experts in operative paragraph 8 within two years, and as appropriate thereafter.

Security Council Annual Report

Note by the President of the Security Council of 26 July 2010 (S/2010/507)

Para. 71(a): The draft introduction to the Annual Report of the Security Council to the General Assembly should continue to be prepared under the leadership and responsibility of the President of the Council for the month of July of each calendar year.

The drafting of the introduction to the Annual Report is expected to continue during September 2011.

The Council further requests the Secretary-General to propose in his next annual report a strategic framework to guide the UN’s implementation of the resolution in the next decade, which includes targets and indicators and takes account of relevant processes within the Secretariat. In this context, the Council requests the Secretary-General to include recommendations for policy and institutional reforms in the UN that will facilitate improved response by the Organization to women and peace and security issues” (15 th para.).
