**AFRICA**

**CAR: SG reports on the situation in CAR and MINUSCA**

Resolution [2552 \(2020\)](#) of 12 November 2020

Para. 54: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Council on 15 February 2021, 15 June 2021 and 11 October 2021, including on: the situation in the CAR, including the security situation, the priority political elements as defined above regarding the political process, including the electoral process and other issues as set out in paragraph 9 and 12 of this resolution, and the implementation of the Peace Agreement, progress on mechanisms and capacity to advance governance and fiscal management, and relevant information on the progress, promotion and protection of human rights and international humanitarian law and on the protection of civilians; the status of the implementation of MINUSCA's mandated tasks, including support to non-United Nations security forces in strict compliance with the HRDDP, including by providing appropriate financial information; force and police generation and deployment of all MINUSCA's constituent elements, and information on the progress in the implementation of the measures taken to improve MINUSCA's performance, including measures to ensure force effectiveness as outlined in paragraphs 34 to 42, as well as information on the implementation of the zero-tolerance policy on sexual exploitation and abuse as outlined in paragraph 41;

Resolution [2566 \(2021\)](#) of 12 March 2021

Para. 2: [...] requests the Secretary-General to review implementation, performance and necessity ahead of each phase as part of the reports requested in paragraph 54 of resolution [2552 \(2020\)](#) and to include in its report of 11 October 2021 a proposal on the overall configuration of MINUSCA's Force;

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in October 2021.

**CAR: France to report to SC on implementation of mandate to support MINUSCA**

Resolution [2552 \(2020\)](#) of 12 November 2020

Para. 52: Authorises French armed forces, within the provisions of their existing bilateral agreement with the CAR and the limits of their capacities and areas of deployment, at the request of the Secretary-General, to use all the means to provide operational support to elements of MINUSCA when under serious threat, from the date of adoption of this resolution, and requests France to ensure reporting to the Council on the implementation of this mandate and to coordinate its reporting with that of the Secretary-General referred to in paragraph 54 of this resolution;

**DRC: SG reports on MONUSCO**

Resolution [2556 \(2020\)](#) of 18 December 2020

Para. 55: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Council every three months on the situation in the DRC, including progress towards the strengthening of State institutions, key governance and security reforms, and on the implementation of MONUSCO's mandate, including [...]

Para. 50: Requests the Secretary-General to present to the Council in the third three-month report no later than September 2021 a transition plan on the basis of the Joint Strategy defining the practical modalities of the transfer of tasks to the Government of the DRC, the UNCT and other stakeholders, including a set of detailed, measurable and realistic benchmarks with indicative timelines defined in partnership with the Government and the UNCT, roles and responsibilities, risks assessment and mitigation strategies, as appropriate, for the progressive and phased drawdown of MONUSCO.

The report of the Secretary-General dated 17 September 2021 ([S/2021/807](#)) is before the Security Council.

**Great Lakes Region: SG reports on implementation of the commitments under the PSC Framework**

Resolution [2556 \(2020\)](#) of 18 December 2020

Para. 56: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council every six months, in coordination with the Secretary-General's Special Envoy for the Great Lakes Region and the SRSG for the DRC on the implementation of the commitments under the PSC Framework and its linkages with the broader security situation in the Great Lakes Region;

The report of the Secretary-General dated 30 September 2021 ([S/2021/836](#)) is before the Security Council.

**Mali: SG reports on MINUSMA on the implementation of resolution [2584 \(2021\)](#)**

Resolution [2584 \(2021\)](#) of 29 June 2021

Para. 61: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council every three months after the adoption of this resolution on the implementation of this resolution, focusing on: (i) progress in achieving the priority measures referenced in paragraphs 4 and 15, and whether and how the mission's activities have contributed toward achieving the mission's strategic priorities referenced in paragraph 21 and priority tasks referenced in paragraph 30, (ii) coordination, exchange of information and, when applicable, mutual operational and logistical support, between MINUSMA, the MDSF, the FC-G5S, the French Forces and the European partners, including Task Force Takuba, and the European Union missions in Mali, (iii) measures to improve external communication of the mission;

[S/PRST/2020/10](#) of 15 October 2020

Last para.: The Security Council also requests MINUSMA, within its mandate and existing resources, to support the political transition in Mali, particularly by exercising good offices, confidence-building and facilitation at the national and local levels, and by supporting, together with the United Nations country team, the holding of inclusive, free, fair, transparent, and credible elections, conducted in a peaceful environment, including through the provision of technical assistance and security arrangements, consistent with the provisions of the Agreement. It requests the Secretary General to include in its quarterly reports updates on how MINUSMA supports the political transition.

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in October 2021.

**Somalia: AU written reports on the implementation of AMISOM's mandate**

Resolution [2568 \(2021\)](#) of 12 March 2021

Para. 39: Requests the African Union to keep the Security Council informed every 90 days, through the Secretary-General, on the implementation of AMISOM's mandate, through no fewer than three, detailed written reports, with the first no later than 1 May 2021 and further requests in this regard, specific reporting on: (i) progress on joint operations in support of the STP including the use and effectiveness of coordination mechanisms; (ii) progress against revised objectives and functions set out in paragraphs 11 and 12; (iii) accountability measures taken to address underperformance, including command and control, and conduct and discipline; (iv) measures taken to protect civilians; (v) equipment review outcomes and use of force assets; and (vi) staffing of the civilian component, and encourages timely reporting to allow for the Council to take into account African Union perspectives on the situation in Somalia;

**Somalia: AMISOM: Federal Government of Somalia to update the SC on the endorsement and implementation of STP**

Resolution [2568 \(2021\)](#) of 12 March 2021

Para. 40: Requests the FGS to update the Security Council on the status of the endorsement of the STP by 1 May 2021, and to report on its implementation by the end of October 2021;

**Somalia: Sanctions: 751 Committee (Somalia) briefings to SC**

Resolution 1844 (2008) of 20 November 2008

Para. 11: Decides further to expand the mandate of the Committee as set out in resolution 751(1992) to include the following tasks:

(g) to report at least every 120 days to the Security Council on its work and on the implementation of this resolution, with its observations and recommendations, in particular on ways to strengthen the effectiveness of the measures imposed by paragraphs 1, 3 and 7 above.

Resolution 2444 (2018) of 14 November 2018

Para. 55: Requests the Committee, in accordance with its mandate and in consultation with the Panel of Experts and other relevant United Nations entities, to consider the recommendations contained in the reports of the Panel of Experts and recommend to the Security Council ways to improve the implementation of and compliance with the Somalia arms embargo, the measures regarding the import and export of charcoal from Somalia, as well as implementation of the measures imposed by paragraphs 1, 3 and 7 of resolutions 1844 (2008) in response to continuing violations;

The Committee Chair is expected to report in October 2021.

**Somalia: Sanctions: Panel of Experts to submit final report to SC**

Resolution 2551 (2020) of 12 November 2020

Para. 34: Requests the Panel to provide regular updates to the Committee, including a minimum of four different thematic reports, a comprehensive mid-term update and, for the Security Council's consideration, through the Committee, a final report by 15 October 2021 and urges the Panel to seek feedback from the Committee on the findings of their reporting;

The final PoE report is expected to be presented by 15 October 2021.

**Somalia: Sanctions: Emergency Relief Coordinator to report to SC**

Resolution 2551 (2020) of 12 November 2020

Para. 36: Requests the Emergency Relief Coordinator to report to the Security Council by 15 October 2021 on the delivery of humanitarian assistance in Somalia and on any impediments to the delivery of humanitarian assistance in Somalia;

The report of the Emergency Relief Coordinator is expected to be issued in October 2021.

**Sudan: SG to provide the SC with an assessment on lessons learned from UNAMID**

Resolution 2559 (2020) of 22 December 2020

Para. 15: Requests the Secretary-General to provide the Security Council with an assessment on lessons learned from the experience of UNAMID no later than 31 October 2021;

The Secretary-General is expected to report in October 2021.

**Sudan/South Sudan: SG to inform SC of progress in implementing UNISFA's mandate**

Resolution 2575 (2021) of 11 May 2021

Para. 8: Requests the Secretary General to continue to inform the Security Council of progress in implementing UNISFA's mandate as set out in paragraph 33 of resolution 2550 (2020), with a written report no later than 15 October 2021;

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in October 2021.

**Sudan/South Sudan: SG to conduct and provide to SC a strategic review of UNISFA**

Resolution 2575 (2021) of 11 May 2021

Para. 7: Requests the Secretary-General, in accordance with best practices, conduct and provide the Security Council, no later than 30 September 2021, a strategic review of UNISFA assessing recent political developments between and within Sudan and South Sudan and providing detailed recommendations for further reconfiguration of the mission and establishing a viable exit strategy, which should prioritize the safety and security of civilians living in Abyei, account for stability of the region, and include an option for an exit strategy for UNISFA that is not limited by the 2011 agreements;

The letter of the Secretary-General dated 17 September 2021 ([S/2021/805](#)) is before the Security Council.

**Sudan/South Sudan: SG to inform SC on status of compliance with resolution 2046 (2012)**

Resolution 2046 (2012) of 2 May 2012

Para. 6: Requests the Secretary-General to consult with the African Union on the implementation of this resolution and the decisions of the AU PSC, to work closely with the AUHIP in support of its facilitation efforts, and to inform the Security Council within 15 days and in two week intervals thereafter on the status of compliance by Sudan, South Sudan, and the SPLM-N with the decisions set forth in this resolution, and expresses its intention, in the event that any or all of the parties have not complied with the decisions set forth in this resolution, to take appropriate additional measures under Article 41 of the Charter as necessary.

Note by the PSC of 2 December 2016 (S/2016/1029)

Following consultations among the members of the Security Council, it has been agreed to amend the reporting period established in paragraph 6 of resolution 2046 (2012), and subsequently amended in notes by the President of the Security Council ([S/2013/657](#) and [S/2014/613](#)), to six-month intervals, beginning with the first report under the new timeline due to the Council by 15 May 2017.

The Secretary-General is expected to report in October 2021.

**Western Sahara: MINURSO mandate**

Resolution 2548 (2020) of 30 October 2020

Para. 1: Decides to extend the mandate of MINURSO until 31 October 2021;

The mandate will expire on 31 October 2021.

**Western Sahara: SG report on Western Sahara**

Resolution 2548 (2020) of 30 October 2020

Para. 10: Requests the Secretary-General to brief the Security Council on a regular basis, and at any time he deems appropriate during the mandate period, to include within six months of this mandate's renewal and again prior to its expiration, on the status and progress of these negotiations under his auspices, on the implementation of this resolution, challenges to MINURSO's operations and steps taken to address them, expresses its intention to meet to receive and discuss his briefings and in this regard, further requests the Secretary-General to provide a report on the situation in Western Sahara well before the end of the mandate period;

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in October 2021.

**Haiti: BINUH mandate**

Resolution [2547 \(2020\)](#) of 15 October 2020

Para. 1: Decides to extend, to 15 October 2021 the mandate of BINUH in accordance with its resolution [2476 \(2019\)](#), headed by a Special Representative of the Secretary-General of the United Nations, and the reporting requirements specified in resolution [2476 \(2019\)](#);

The mandate will expire on 15 October 2021.

**Haiti: SG reports on BINUH on the implementation of resolution [2547 \(2020\)](#)**

Resolution [2547 \(2020\)](#) of 15 October 2020

Para. 1: Decides to extend, to 15 October 2021 the mandate of BINUH in accordance with its resolution [2476 \(2019\)](#), headed by a Special Representative of the Secretary-General of the United Nations, and the reporting requirements specified in resolution [2476 \(2019\)](#);

The report of the Secretary-General dated 27 September 2021 ([S/2021/828](#)) is before the Security Council.

**Colombia: Verification Mission mandate**

Resolution [2574 \(2021\)](#) of 11 May 2021

Para. 4: Decides to extend the mandate of the Verification Mission until 31 October 2021;

**Colombia: SG to report on Verification Mission**

Resolution [2574 \(2021\)](#) of 11 May 2021

Para. 3: Welcomes the Secretary-General's proposal to incorporate reporting with respect to the verification of compliance with the sentences referred to in paragraph 1 of this resolution within the existing reporting cycle for the Verification Mission, and to keep the Council fully informed of the preparations of the Verification Mission and the progress, assessment, and eventual results of the verification;

Para. 5: Requests the Secretary-General to brief the Council monthly and to provide a report on a regular basis, at least every 60 days, on the implementation of resolutions [2139 \(2014\)](#), [2165 \(2014\)](#), [2191 \(2014\)](#), [2258 \(2015\)](#), [2332 \(2016\)](#), [2393 \(2017\)](#), [2401 \(2018\)](#), [2449 \(2018\)](#), [2504 \(2020\)](#), [2533 \(2020\)](#) and this resolution and on compliance by all relevant parties in Syria and further requests the Secretary-General to include in his reports overall trends in United Nations cross-line operations, in particular on the implementation of the above mentioned activities on improving all modalities of humanitarian deliveries inside Syria and early recovery projects, and detailed information on the humanitarian assistance delivered through United Nations humanitarian cross-border operations, including the distribution mechanism, the number of beneficiaries, operating partners, locations of aid deliveries at district-level and the volume and nature of items delivered;

**Middle East (UNDOF): SG reports on developments in the situation and measures taken to implement resolution [338 \(1973\)](#)**

Para. 16: Requests the Secretary-General to report every 90 days on developments in the situation and the measures taken to implement resolution [338 \(1973\)](#).

**Middle East (Yemen): SG to report to SC on implementation of resolution [2586 \(2021\)](#) and resolution [2451 \(2018\)](#)**

The members of the Security Council have agreed upon a schedule of meetings on UNMIK, with concurrent Secretary-General reports to the Council. In 2019, the Council intends to hold briefings on 7 February, in June, and in October. As of 2020, the Council intends to hold briefings twice a year (in April and October) on the issue. The Council will continue to review this issue, taking into account the situation on the ground.
