This tentative forecast of the programme of work of the Security Council has been prepared by the Secretariat for the President of the Council. The forecast covers in particular those matters that may be taken up during the month pursuant to earlier decisions of the Council. The fact that a matter is or is not included in the forecast carries no implication that it will or will not be taken up during the month: the actual programme of work will be determined by developments and the views of members of the Council.

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SECURITY COUNCIL FOR THE MONTH OF FEBRUARY 2022**

**AFRICA**

**CAR: SG reports on the situation in CAR and MINUSCA**

Resolution 2605 (2021) of 12 November 2021

Para. 58: (a) Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Council on 15 February 2022, 15 June 2022 and 14 October 2022, including on: the situation in the CAR, including the security situation, the respect by all parties of the ceasefire, the political process, the implementation of the APPR, including efforts made by MINUSCA to support the ceasefire and DDR process, progress on mechanisms and capacity to advance governance and fiscal management, and relevant information on the progress, promotion and protection of human rights and international humanitarian law and on the protection of civilians; violations of the Status of Forces Agreement and follow up on efforts to hold perpetrators accountable, including through joint investigations, as well as attacks, provocations and incitement to hatred and violence and disinformation campaigns against MINUSCA; the status of the implementation of MINUSCA's mandated tasks, including instances in which MINUSCA was unable to reach civilians in response to POC alerts; force and police generation and deployment of all MINUSCA's constituent elements, and information on the progress in the implementation of the measures taken to improve MINUSCA's performance, including measures to ensure force effectiveness as outlined in paragraphs 37 to 45, as well as information on the implementation of the zero-tolerance policy on sexual exploitation and abuse as outlined in paragraphs 42 and 43; overall Mission performance, the Mission's implementation of the Integrated Peacekeeping Performance and Accountability Framework (IPPAF) and Comprehensive Planning and Performance Assessment System (CPAS); including information on undeclared caveats, declining to participate in or undertake patrols and their impact on the mission, and how the reported cases of under-performance are addressed; implementation, performance and necessity ahead of each phase of the reinforcements decided in resolution 2566 (2021) and recalled in this resolution;

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in February 2022.

**CAR: France to report to SC on implementation of mandate to support MINUSCA**

Resolution 2605 (2021) of 12 November 2021

Para. 56: Authorises French armed forces, within the provisions of their existing bilateral agreement with the CAR and the limits of their capacities and areas of deployment, at the request of the Secretary-General, to use all the means to provide operational support to elements of MINUSCA when under serious threat, from the date of adoption of this resolution, and requests France to ensure reporting to the Council on the implementation of this mandate and to coordinate its reporting with that of the Secretary-General referred to in paragraph 58 of this resolution;

**Mali: Sanctions: Panel of Experts midterm and final reports**

Resolution 2590 (2021) of 30 August 2021

Para. 4: Requests the Panel of Experts to provide to the Council, after discussion with the Committee, a midterm report no later than 28 February 2022, a final report no later than 15 August 2022, and periodic updates in between, as appropriate;

The PoE midterm report is expected to be provided no later than 28 February 2022.

**Somalia: SG reports on the implementation of resolutions [2592 \(2021\)](#) [UNSOM] and [2568 \(2021\)](#) [AMISOM]**

Resolution [2592 \(2021\)](#) of 30 August 2021

Para. 17: Requests the Secretary-General to keep the Security Council regularly informed on the implementation of this resolution, and to identify and report on progress towards achieving key political benchmarks, in particular progress towards elections, including through oral updates and no fewer than four written reports, with the first written report due by 15 November and every 90 days thereafter;

Resolution [2592 \(2021\)](#) of 30 August 2021

Para. 15: Requests the United Nations, the FGS and FMS to consider the adverse implications of climate change, environmental degradation, other ecological changes and natural disasters, among other factors, in their programmes in Somalia, including by undertaking comprehensive risk assessments and risk management strategies relating to these factors, and requests the Secretary-General to provide an update in mandated reporting as appropriate;

Resolution [2568 \(2021\)](#) of 12 March 2021

Para.41: Requests the Secretary-General to keep the Security Council regularly informed on the implementation of this resolution, in his regular reports requested in paragraph 16 of resolution [2540 \(2020\)](#) and in this regard further requests the Secretary-General to assess in his regular reports: (i) implementation of the STP and MAF as referenced in paragraph 1 of this resolution; (ii) implementation of HRDDP; and (iii) UNSOS support to AMISOM, UNSOM and the Somali security forces;

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in February 2022.

**Somalia: Sanctions: 751 Committee (Somalia) briefings to SC**

Resolution [1844 \(2008\)](#) of 20 November 2008

Para. 11: Decides further to expand the mandate of the Committee as set out in resolution [751\(1992\)](#) to include the following tasks:

(g) to report at least every 120 days to the Security Council on its work and on the implementation of this resolution, with its observations and recommendations, in particular on ways to strengthen the effectiveness of the measures imposed by paragraphs 1, 3 and 7 above.

Resolution [2444 \(2018\)](#) of 14 November 2018

Para. 55: Requests the Committee, in accordance with its mandate and in consultation with the Panel of Experts and other relevant United Nations entities, to consider the recommendations contained in the reports of the Panel of Experts and recommend to the Security Council ways to improve the implementation of and compliance with the Somalia arms embargo, the measures regarding the import and export of charcoal from Somalia, as well as implementation of the measures imposed by paragraphs 1, 3 and 7 of resolutions [1844 \(2008\)](#) in response to continuing violations;

The Committee Chair is expected to brief the Council in February 2022.

**Somalia: Sanctions: FGS to report to SC**

Resolution [2607 \(2021\)](#) of 15 November 2021

Para. 44: Requests the FGS to report to the Security Council in accordance with paragraph 9 of resolution [2182 \(2014\)](#) and as requested in paragraph 7 of resolution [2244 \(2015\)](#), by 1 February 2022 and then by 1 August 2022, including: (a) the structure, composition, strength and disposition of its security forces, and the status of regional and militia forces, (i) including as annexes the reports of the Joint Verification Team (JVT) requested in paragraph 7 of resolution [2182 \(2014\)](#) and para 37 of resolution [2551 \(2020\)](#), and (ii) incorporating the notifications regarding the destination unit in the SNSF or the place of storage of military equipment upon distribution of imported arms and ammunition; (b) an update summarising suspicious activity documented by domestic financial institutions, and investigations and actions undertaken by the Financial Reporting Centre to counter the financing of terrorism and in a manner so as to protect the confidentiality of sensitive information; (c) an update on the status of individuals designated by the Committee, where information is available;

### **Sudan: Sanctions: SC review of Panel of Experts mandate**

Resolution 2562 (2021) of 11 February 2021

Para. 2: Decides to extend until 12 March 2022 the mandate of the Panel of Experts originally appointed pursuant to resolution 1591 (2005) and previously extended by resolutions 1779 (2007), 1841 (2008), 1945 (2010), 2035 (2012), 2138 (2014), 2200 (2015), 2265 (2016), 2340 (2017), and 2400 (2018), reaffirms the mandate of the Panel of Experts' as established in resolutions 1591 (2005), 1779 (2007), 1841 (2008), 1945 (2010), 2035 (2012), 2138 (2014), 2200 (2015), 2265 (2016), 2340 (2017), 2400 (2018), 2455 (2019), and 2508 (2020), and requests the Panel of Experts to provide to the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1591 (2005) concerning the Sudan (hereafter "the Committee") with an interim report on its activities no later than 12 August 2021, and provide to the Council, after discussion with the Committee, a final report by 13 January 2022 with its findings and recommendations, and further requests the Panel of Experts to provide updates every three months to the Committee regarding its activities, including Panel travel, and the implementation and effectiveness of paragraph 10 of resolution 1945 (2010), and expresses its intention to review the mandate and take appropriate action regarding the further extension of the mandate no later than 12 February 2022;

The Security Council is expected to take action no later than 12 February 2022.

## **AMERICAS**

### **Haiti: SG reports on BINUH on the implementation of resolution 2600 (2021)**

Resolution 2600 (2021) of 15 October 2021

Para.1: Decides to extend, to 15 July 2022 the mandate of BINUH in accordance with its resolution 2476 (2019), headed by a Special Representative of the Secretary-General of the United Nations, and the reporting requirements specified in resolution 2476 (2019);

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in February 2022.

## **ASIA/MIDDLE EAST**

### **Afghanistan: SG reports on UNAMA**

Resolution 2596 (2021) of 17 September 2021

Para. 5: Requests the Secretary-General to submit a written report to the Security Council by 31 January 2022 on strategic and operational recommendations for the mandate of UNAMA, in light of recent political, security and social developments, further requests the Secretary-General to brief the Council on the situation in Afghanistan and the work of UNAMA every other month until 17 March 2022;

The report of the Secretary-General dated 28 January 2022 (S/2022/64) is before the Security Council.

### **Iraq: SG reports on UNAMI**

Resolution 2576 (2021) of 27 May 2021

Para. 7: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Council every three months on the progress made towards the fulfilment of all UNAMI's responsibilities;

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in February 2022.

### **Iraq/Kuwait: missing persons and return of property**

Resolution 2107 (2013) of 27 June 2013

Para. 4: requests that the Special Representative of the Secretary-General and Head of the United Nations Assistance Mission to Iraq (UNAMI) promote, support and facilitate efforts regarding the repatriation or return of all Kuwaiti and third country nationals or their remains, and the return of Kuwaiti property, including the national

archives, seized by Iraq, further requests the Secretary-General to report separately to the Security Council on these matters in his reports on the progress made towards the fulfilment of all UNAMI's responsibilities...;

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in February 2022.

### **Iraq: Final Report of Governing Council on UN Compensation Commission**

Resolution 692 (1991) of 20 May 1991

Para. 3: Decides to establish the Fund and the United Nations Compensation Commission referred to in paragraph 18 of resolution [687 \(1991\)](#) in accordance with section I of the Secretary-General's report, and decides also that the Governing Council of the Commission will be located at the United Nations Office at Geneva and that the Governing Council may decide whether some of the activities of the Commission should be carried out elsewhere;

The final report of the Governing Council on the UN Compensation Commission is expected to be provided in February 2022.

### **The situation in the Middle East, including the Palestinian question**

Resolution 1322 (2000) of 7 October 2000

Para. 7: Invites the Secretary-General to continue to follow the situation and to keep the Security Council informed.

### **Middle East (Syria): OPCW DG to report to SC (through SG) on implementation of resolution [2118 \(2013\)](#)**

Resolution [2118 \(2013\)](#) of 27 September 2013

Para.12: Decides to review on a regular basis the implementation in the Syrian Arab Republic of the decision of the OPCW Executive Council of 27 September 2013 and this resolution, and requests the Director-General of the OPCW to report to the Security Council, through the Secretary-General, who shall include relevant information on United Nations activities related to the implementation of this resolution, within 30 days and every month thereafter, and requests further the Director-General of the OPCW and the Secretary-General to report in a coordinated manner, as needed, to the Security Council, non-compliance with this resolution or the OPCW Executive Council decision of 27 September 2013;

The report is expected to be presented in February 2022.

### **Middle East (Syria): SG briefings and reports on the implementation of resolutions [2139 \(2014\)](#), [2165 \(2014\)](#), [2191 \(2014\)](#), [2258 \(2015\)](#), [2332 \(2016\)](#), [2393 \(2017\)](#), [2401 \(2018\)](#), [2449 \(2018\)](#), [2504 \(2020\)](#), [2533 \(2020\)](#), and [2585 \(2021\)](#)**

Resolution [2585 \(2021\)](#) of 9 July 2021

Para. 5: Requests the Secretary-General to brief the Council monthly and to provide a report on a regular basis, at least every 60 days, on the implementation of resolutions [2139 \(2014\)](#), [2165 \(2014\)](#), [2191 \(2014\)](#), [2258 \(2015\)](#), [2332 \(2016\)](#), [2393 \(2017\)](#), [2401 \(2018\)](#), [2449 \(2018\)](#), [2504 \(2020\)](#), [2533 \(2020\)](#) and this resolution and on compliance by all relevant parties in Syria and further requests the Secretary-General to include in his reports overall trends in United Nations cross-line operations, in particular on the implementation of the above mentioned activities on improving all modalities of humanitarian deliveries inside Syria and early recovery projects, and detailed information on the humanitarian assistance delivered through United Nations humanitarian cross-border operations, including the distribution mechanism, the number of beneficiaries, operating partners, locations of aid deliveries at district-level and the volume and nature of items delivered;

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in February 2022.

**Middle East (Syria): SG report on the implementation of resolution 2268 (2016)**

Resolution 2268 (2016) of 26 February 2016

Para.10: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Council on the implementation of this resolution, including by drawing on information provided by the ISSG ceasefire taskforce, and on resolution 2254 (2015), within 15 days of the adoption of this resolution and every 30 days thereafter;

The Secretary-General is expected to report in February 2022.

**Middle East (Yemen): SG to report to SC on implementation of resolution 2586 (2021) and resolution 2451 (2018)**

Resolution 2586 (2021) of 14 July 2021

Para. 7: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council on a monthly basis on progress regarding the implementation of this resolution, including on any obstructions to the effective operation of UNMHA caused by any party; and on resolution 2451 (2018), including on any non-compliance by any party;

The Secretary-General is expected to report in February 2022.

**Middle East (Yemen): Sanctions: Assets freeze and travel ban**

Resolution 2564 (2021) of 25 February 2021

Para. 2: Decides to renew until 28 February 2022 the measures imposed by paragraphs 11 and 15 of resolution 2140 (2014), reaffirms the provisions of paragraphs 12, 13, 14 and 16 of resolution 2140 (2015), and further reaffirms the provisions of paragraphs 14 to 17 of resolution 2216 (2015);

The assets freeze and travel ban will expire on 28 February 2022.

**Middle East (Yemen): Sanctions: SC review of Panel of Experts mandate**

Resolution 2564 (2021) of 25 February 2021

Para. 9: Decides to extend until 28 March 2022 the mandate of the Panel of Experts as set out in paragraph 21 of resolution 2140 (2014), and paragraph 21 of resolution 2216 (2015), expresses its intention to review the mandate and take appropriate action regarding the further extension no later than 28 February 2022, and requests the Secretary-General to take the necessary administrative measures as expeditiously as possible to re-establish the Panel of Experts, in consultation with the Committee until 28 March 2022 drawing, as appropriate, on the expertise of the members of the Panel established pursuant to resolution 2140 (2014);

The Security Council is expected to take action no later than 28 February 2022.

**COUNTER-TERRORISM/NON-PROLIFERATION**

**ISIL (Da'esh) and Al-Qaeda: SG strategic-level reports**

Resolution 2368 (2017) of 20 July 2017

Para. 101: Emphasizing the threat posed to international peace and security by ISIL and associated individuals, groups, undertakings, and entities, requests the Secretary-General to continue to provide strategic-level reports that demonstrate and reflect the gravity of the aforementioned threat, including from foreign terrorist fighters joining ISIL and associated groups and entities, foreign terrorist fighters returning to their countries of origin, transiting through, traveling to or relocating to or from other Member States, and the sources of financing of these groups and entities including through illicit trade in petroleum, antiquities, and other natural resources, as well as their planning and facilitation of attacks, any support to ISIL, Al-Qaida or any individual included on the ISIL and Al-Qaida Sanctions List, and reflects the range of United Nations efforts in support of Member States in countering this threat, the next report to be provided by 31 January 2018 and then every six months thereafter, with the input of CTED, in close collaboration with the Monitoring Team, as well as other relevant United Nations actors;

The report of the Secretary-General dated 28 January 2022 ([S/2022/63](#)) is before the Security Council.

**Non-proliferation/DPRK: Sanctions: 1718 Committee reports**

Resolution [1718 \(2006\)](#) of 14 October 2006

Para. 12: Decides to establish, in accordance with rule 28 of its provisional rules of procedure, a Committee of the Security Council consisting of all the members of the Council, to undertake the following tasks:

(g) To report at least every 90 days to the Security Council on its work, with its observations and recommendations, in particular on ways to strengthen the effectiveness of the measures imposed by paragraph 8 above.

The 1718 Committee is expected to report in February 2022.

**Non-proliferation/DPRK: Sanctions: Panel of Experts midterm and final reports to the SC**

Resolution [2569 \(2021\)](#) of 26 March 2021

Para. 2: Requests the Panel of Experts to provide to the Committee no later than 3 August 2021 a midterm report on its work, as requested in paragraph 43 of resolution [2321 \(2016\)](#), and further requests that, after a discussion with the Committee, the Panel of Experts submit to the Council its midterm report by 6 September 2021, and requests also a final report to the Committee no later than 28 January 2022 with its findings and recommendations, and further requests that, after a discussion with the Committee, the Panel of Experts submit to the Council its final report no later than 25 February 2022;

The PoE final report is expected to be provided no later than 25 February 2022.

**WMD: 1540 Committee mandate**

Resolution [2572 \(2021\)](#) of 22 April 2021

Para. 1: Decides to extend until 28 February 2022 the mandate of the 1540 Committee with the continued assistance of its group of experts, as specified in paragraph 5 of resolution [1977 \(2011\)](#), and requests the Secretary-General to take the necessary administrative measures to this effect;

The mandate will expire on 28 February 2022.
