AFRICA

CAR: SG reports on the situation in CAR and MINUSCA

Resolution 2709 (2023) of 15 November 2023

Para. 58: (a) Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Council on 15 February 2024, 15 June 2024 and 13 October 2024 on the progress in implementing MINUSCA's mandate, as well as on the situation in the CAR, including on all elements set out in paragraph 58 (a) of resolution 2659 (2022);

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in February 2024.

Libya: UNSMIL: SG to report to SC on the implementation of resolution 2702 (2023)

Resolution 2702 (2023) of 30 October 2023

Para. 13: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council on the implementation of this resolution every 60 days;

The Secretary-General is expected to report in February 2024.

Somalia: SG reports on the implementation of resolutions 2705 (2023)

Resolution 2705 (2023) of 31 October 2023

Para. 14: Requests the following reports from the Secretary-General:

a.regular updates on the situation in Somalia and implementation of UNSOM's mandate, to include updates against the benchmarks outlined in the strategic review, including through briefings to the Security Council and no fewer than three written reports, with the first report due by 1 February 2024, and every 120 days thereafter; and, [...]

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in February 2024.

South Sudan: SG report on implementation of the UNMISS mandate and obstructions

Resolution 2677 (2023) of 15 March 2023

Para. 32: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council on implementation of the UNMISS mandate and the obstructions UNMISS encounters in doing so in a comprehensive written report to be submitted within 90 days of the date of adoption of this resolution, every 90 days thereafter, and underscores that such reporting should provide integrated, evidence-based and data-driven analysis, strategic assessments and frank advice to the Security Council and should include attention to [...]

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in February 2024.

Sudan: SG to reports on UN efforts to support Sudan

Resolution 2715 (2023) of 1 December 2023

Para. 7: Requests the Secretary-General to provide a written report in 90 days, and then brief the Security Council every 120 days on UN efforts to support Sudan on its path towards peace and stability, and to keep this reporting under review;

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in February 2024.

ASIA/MIDDLE EAST

The situation in the Middle East, including the Palestinian question

Resolution [1322 \(2000\)](#) of 7 October 2000

Para. 7: Invites the Secretary-General to continue to follow the situation and to keep the Security Council informed.

Resolution [2720 \(2023\)](#) of 22 December 2023

Para. 6: Determines that the Coordinator will have the necessary personnel and equipment in Gaza, under the authority of the United Nations, to perform these, and other functions as determined by the Security Council, and requests that the Coordinator report to the Security Council on its work, with an initial report within 20 days and thereafter every 90 days through 30 September 2024;

Para 15: Requests the Secretary-General to report on the implementation of this resolution in the regular reporting to the Council;

The Secretary-General is expected to report in February 2024.

Middle East (Syria): SG report on the implementation of resolution [2268 \(2016\)](#)

Resolution [2268 \(2016\)](#) of 26 February 2016

Para. 10: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Council on the implementation of this resolution, including by drawing on information provided by the ISSG ceasefire taskforce, and on resolution [2254 \(2015\)](#), within 15 days of the adoption of this resolution and every 30 days thereafter;

The Secretary-General is expected to report in February 2024.

Middle East (Syria): OPCW DG to report to SC (through SG) on implementation of resolution [2118 \(2013\)](#)

Resolution [2118 \(2013\)](#) of 27 September 2013

Para. 12: Decides to review on a regular basis the implementation in the Syrian Arab Republic of the decision of the OPCW Executive Council of 27 September 2013 and this resolution, and requests the Director-General of the OPCW to report to the Security Council, through the Secretary-General, who shall include relevant information on United Nations activities related to the implementation of this resolution, within 30 days and every month thereafter, and requests further the Director-General of the OPCW and the Secretary-General to report in a coordinated manner, as needed, to the Security Council, non-compliance with this resolution or the OPCW Executive Council decision of 27 September 2013.

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in February 2024.

Middle East (Yemen): SG to report to SC on implementation of resolution [2691 \(2023\)](#)

Resolution [2691 \(2023\)](#) of 10 July 2023

Para. 2: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council on a monthly basis on progress regarding the implementation of this resolution, in accordance with paragraph 8 of resolution [2643 \(2022\)](#);

Resolution [2643 \(2022\)](#) of 13 July 2022

Para. 8: Requests the Secretary-General to report to the Security Council on a monthly basis on progress regarding the implementation of this resolution, including, inter alia on any obstructions to the effective operation of UNMHA caused by any party, any violations of the Hodeidah Agreement ceasefire, any attempts to bring any military reinforcements and military objects to and through the city, the ports of Hodeidah, Salif, and Ras Issa, and the governorate, any failures to remove any military manifestations from the city, and on resolution [2451 \(2018\)](#), including on any non-compliance by any party;

The Secretary-General is expected to report in February 2024.

Middle East (Yemen): SG to report to SC under resolution [2722 \(2024\)](#)

Resolution [2722 \(2024\)](#) of 10 January 2024

Para. 10: Requests the Secretary-General provide written monthly reports, through July 1, 2024, to the Security Council on any further Houthi attacks on merchant and commercial vessels in the Red Sea to inform the Council's future consultations;

The report of the Secretary-General is expected to be issued in February 2024.

COUNTER-TERRORISM/NON-PROLIFERATION

Non-proliferation/DPRK: Sanctions: 1718 Committee reports

Resolution [1718 \(2006\)](#) of 14 October 2006

Para. 12: Decides to establish, in accordance with rule 28 of its provisional rules of procedure, a Committee of the Security Council consisting of all the members of the Council, to undertake the following tasks:

(g) To report at least every 90 days to the Security Council on its work, with its observations and recommendations, in particular on ways to strengthen the effectiveness of the measures imposed by paragraph 8 above.

The Committee Chair is expected to report in February 2024.
