

## **Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1718 (2006)**

Updated on 24 April 2018 (Originally issued on 21 January 2011)

### **Implementation Assistance Notice No. 2: Guidelines on the Preparation and Submission of National Implementation Reports**

The Committee established pursuant to resolution 1718 (2006) believes the information below may assist States in preparing and submitting reports to the Committee on measures they have taken to implement certain provisions in resolutions 1718 (2006), 1874 (2009), 2087 (2013), 2094 (2013), 2270 (2016), 2321 (2016), 2356 (2017), 2371 (2017), 2375 (2017) and 2397 (2017).

1. Paragraph 17 of resolution 2397 (2017) requires all States to report to the Security Council within ninety days of the adoption of the resolution, and thereafter upon request by the Committee, on concrete measures they have taken in order to implement effectively the provisions of the resolutions.

2. Paragraph 26 of resolution 2397 (2017) reaffirms its support to the Six Party Talks, calls for their resumption, and reiterates its support for the commitments set forth in the Joint Statement of 19 September 2005 issued by China, the DPRK, Japan, the Republic of Korea, the Russian Federation, and the United States, including that the goal of the Six-Party Talks is the verifiable denuclearization of the Korean Peninsula in a peaceful manner, that the United States and the DPRK undertook to respect each other's sovereignty and exist peacefully together, and that the Six Parties undertook to promote economic cooperation, and all other relevant commitments. Paragraph 27 of resolution 2397 (2017) reiterates the importance of maintaining peace and stability on the Korean Peninsula and in north-east Asia at large, and expresses its commitment to a peaceful, diplomatic and political solution to the situation and welcomes efforts by Council members as well as other States to facilitate a peaceful and comprehensive solution through dialogue and stresses the importance of working to reduce tensions in the Korean Peninsula and beyond. Paragraph 30 of resolution 2375 (2017) urges further work to reduce tensions so as to advance the prospects for a comprehensive settlement. Finally, paragraph 31 of resolution 2375 (2017) underscores the imperative of achieving the goal of complete, verifiable and irreversible denuclearization of the Korean Peninsula in a peaceful manner.

3. The Committee encourages all States to prepare and submit these national implementation reports promptly in accordance with the above resolutions. These reports play an important role in helping the Committee and its Panel of Experts facilitate States' efforts to fully implement their obligations.

4. Recognizing that preparing these reports may be burdensome for some States, and in accordance with paragraph 17 of resolution 2397 (2017), the Committee and its Panel of Experts stand ready to assist States, upon request, in preparing and submitting such reports in a timely manner.

5. Towards that end, the Committee has prepared an updated optional checklist template (attached). This checklist is cross-referenced for convenience to the Fact Sheet compiling certain measures imposed by Security Council resolutions 1718 (2006), 1874 (2009), 2087 (2013), 2094 (2013), 2270 (2016), 2321 (2016), 2356 (2017), 2371 (2017), 2375 (2017) and 2397 (2017).

6. The Committee encourages States to use this optional checklist template when providing detailed and comprehensive information regarding the concrete steps States have taken (e.g. new procedures, legislation, regulations or policies, list of relevant ministries/agencies involved, etc.) to implement the various measures.
